

JORHAT KENDRIYA MAHAVIDYALAYA: A PROFILE

Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya is a promising Co-educational premier institution in North- East India offering courses of study in both Arts and Science streams. The College is located at Kenduguri, 3 km. east of Jorhat city centre and is well linked by NH-37 as well as by the Assam Trunk Road. The College was established in 1981 with the noble objective of meeting the needs of higher education of a large locality, quite a number of who belong to the rural and economically weak backgrounds. The College is permanently affiliated to Dibrugarh University. The Arts Stream of the college was brought under the deficit grants-in-aid system from January 11, 1996. Spurred by the interest of students, the Science Stream was introduced from the academic session 1991-92 and received Provincialized status in 2021. The College currently provides both Higher Secondary, UG (CBCS), Three years Degree (Non-CBCS, Distance mode in DODL, TEZU and KKHOSU), PG (Distance mode in KKHOSU) courses to more than a thousand students every academic year, spread over fourteen departments, viz. Assamese, Botany, Chemistry, Economics, Education, English, History, Mathematics, Philosophy, Physics, Political Science, Sociology, Statistics and Zoology. The curriculum followed by the College at the Degree level is the one prescribed by Dibrugarh University. For Higher Secondary (viz, Arts and Science stream), the syllabus and curriculum followed is the one prescribed by the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council. Apart from this, From the academic session 2015, the Tea Plantation and Management Course has been introduced under Community College Scheme sponsored by UGC and from the Academic Session 2017-18, the College introduced the UGC sponsored 3 year Bachelor of Vocational Course (B.Voc) in Small Tea Garden Management. During the academic session 2020-2021, another course under Community College (of UGC) was introduced in Horticulture and Nursery Management. In 2022, eight short term Skill based courses were also introduced under the Incubation and Innovation Cell (Registered as IIC JKM in Innovation Cell, Ministry of Education, Govt. of India, IC-202115536) of the College for imparting skill-based training to students. Courses include LED bulb Production cum Repairing and Training Centre; Vermicompost Production and Training Centre; Green Tea Production and Packaging Course, Computer Basics with Special Knowledge on MS Office and Internet Susceptibility; Course in Sustainable Development of Solid Waste Management, and Certificate Course in Bioinformatics, Soft Skill and Life Skill. The College also facilitates virtual science laboratory, and virtual English lab. Recently, the College has received approval from National Council for teacher Education (NCET) for opening integrated B.Ed. course.

The College, with its academic zeal, aims at providing quality education to rural students while augmenting their meaningful participation in both curricular and extra-curricular activities. The focus is on the process of teaching-learning in rural context with a sense of social responsibility. The college upholds the spirit of humanism and strives to inculcate rationalism among its stakeholders. The College strives to uphold its motto 'Satyamewa Jayate' engraved on the emblem of the College. Taken from the Mundaka Upanishad, the words translate into English as 'Truth alone triumphs'. The line signifies a rootedness to the rich cultural values of the nation and is suggestive of a desire to create confident, dedicated honest and upright individuals who become assets to the society.

There exists an atmosphere of cordial relationship between the students and teachers in the College. Apart from academic pursuits, stress is laid on co- curricular activities and all-round development of the students' personality. Special attention is paid to the students coming from backward and marginalized sections of society whose welfare was on the top of the agenda when the College was established. The College has a well-equipped library, which is supervised and managed by a qualified Librarian. The libra333ry is fully digitalized. Photocopier machine and computers with Internet facilities are available in the College Library. For the benefit of students from economically weaker backgrounds the College has been providing the facility of a Book Bank from the academic session 2011-12.

Set in a campus with greenery of trees, beautiful flower gardens, well positioned decorative flower pots, the College boasts of its scenic beauty and pleasing environment that provides a breather from the noisy atmosphere of the city.

What had started as a humble effort to spread the light of higher education amongst the locality and its neighboring areas has now flowered in to an institution of repute rendering quality education to students from different parts of Assam. With a staff strength of 80 (Teaching and Support) Staff, and over 1500 students, Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya has certainly grown in stature over the years. Since its establishment, the College has come a long way in meeting the emerging needs and challenges of the present -day scenario.

Multiple Exit Facility:

Exit 1: There is a provision of exit after successful completion of 1 year (two semesters): A Certificate will be awarded when a student exits at the end of year 1 (2 semesters). Students who have secured minimum of 44 credits will be awarded a UG certificate (in the field of study/discipline) if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 2nd semester examination.

Exit 2: There is a provision of exit after successful completion of 2 years (four semesters): A Diploma will be awarded when a student exits at the end of year 2 (4 semesters). Students who have secured minimum of 88 credits will be awarded a UG Diploma (in the field of study/discipline) if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 4th Semester examination.

Exit 3: Three Year UG Degree Programme (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelor in other discipline) with single/double major: There is a provision of exit after successful completion of 3 years (six semesters). Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme shall be awarded UG degree in the major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 132 credits.

Four Year UG Programme with Honours (BA, B. Sc, and Bachelor in other discipline) with single/double major: Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours degree in the major discipline after successful completion of four

years with Discipline Specific Elective Courses in 7th and 8th semesters in lieu of Research Project and Dissertation, securing a minimum of 176 credits.

Four Year UG Programme with Honours with Research (BA, B. Sc, and Bachelor in other discipline) with single/double major: Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours with Research degree in the major discipline after successful completion of four years, with Research Project and Dissertation in 7th and 8th Semesters, securing 176 credits.

Examination and Evaluation:

- (a) Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least two times during a Semester including the End Semester Examination.
- (b) There shall be 20% marks for in-semester assessment and 80% marks for End-semester examination in each course during every semester.
- (c) There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer-scripts of the end-semester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny.

(d) In-semester Assessment:

- (i) In in-semester assessment, different tools such as objective tests, written tests, assignments, paper presentation, laboratory work, etc. suitable to the courses may be employed.
- (ii) The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shall be required to compulsorily attend in-semester assessment including appearing the sessional tests, failing which they will not be allowed to appear for the End-semester examination. A Student cannot repeat In-semester examinations. The Department/Centre for Studies may arrange special in-semester examination whenever necessary.

(e) End Semester Examination:

(i) There shall be one End semester examination carrying 80% Marks in each course of a

Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the Course. The End semester examination is normally a written/laboratory-based examination.

- (ii) The Controller of Examinations shall make necessary arrangements for notifying the dates of the End semester examinations and other procedures as per Dibrugarh University Rules (at least 20 days in advance) and the Academic Calendar notified by the University.
- (iii) The time given for End-semester examination for each Course shall be based on the credits/marks of the course.

Betterment Examination:

- i. A student shall be entitled to take the 'Betterment Examinations' in any two theory courses after successful completion of 3 year/4year programme only once. In this case, the higher marks secured by the student shall be retained. The candidates shall have to apply for betterment examination within one year of passing the Sixth/Eight Semester examination. Students shall have to appear in the betterment examination with the regular batch.
- ii. No betterments shall be allowed in the practical/project/dissertation/internship examinations.

Results and Progression:

A candidate shall be declared as passed a Programme, provided he/she secures

- At least 30% of marks in each Course in the End Semester Examinations combining both theory and practical examinations
- At least 'P' grade in the 10 point scale combining both the in-semester and End Semester Examination performance.
 - There shall be no separate pass mark for In-semester Assessment.

A candidate shall be declared as passed a semester/ programme, provided he/ she secures

• at least 'P' grade in the 10 point scale in all the Courses separately. There may be moderation of In-semester Assessment marks/End Semester marks as and when necessary.

Points to note:

- A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more Courses of any end semester examinations up to fifth Semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed course as carry over course(s).
- Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the carryover course in the next regular examinations of those courses.
- If a candidate fails in any of the components (either theory or practical) of a course the candidate shall have to reappear in the examination for both the components.
- If a candidate clears the sixth semester examination before clearing all the courses of the previous semesters, the result of the sixth semester examination of that

- candidate shall be withheld and his/ her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of the previous semesters.
- A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of seventh semester examinations shall be provisionally promoted to the eighth semester with the failed course as carry over course(s).
- If a candidate clears the eight semester examination before clearing all the courses of the seventh semesters, the result of the eighth semester examination of that candidate shall be withheld and his/ her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of the previous semester.
- A student must clear all his/her Semester Examinations within six (6) years for three-year undergraduate programme and seven years for four year undergraduate programme (with honours/research) from the dates of admission to the First Semester of any Programme irrespective of the number of examinations appeared by the student.
- Since the Semester system involves continuous assessment, there shall be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any programme in this system.
- A candidate shall be declared to have passed provided he/she has passed all the Semesters and in all the Courses separately for the concerned programme.
- The Controller of Examinations shall declare the results of different programmes and issue Grade-sheets. The merit list shall be prepared only for the regular candidates and it does not include the backlog candidates.

Attendance:

• A student who has less **than 80% attendance** shall not be permitted to sit for the End-semester examinations in the course in which the shortfall exists. Provided that it shall be open to the University to grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 80% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reason on recommendation of the Head of the Department on payment of a prescribed fee(s).

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

The date of interview cum admission into HS and Degree classes are notified through local
dailies immediately after the declaration of results. Admission schedules are also notified
through the college notice board and College website -
www.jorhatkendriyamahavidyalaya.edu.in
Admission forms issued by the College will have to be duly filled-up and submitted within the
specified date notified in news papers, the college notice board and website.
Students must submit attested copies of mark sheets and certificates of the last examination
passed along with their applications. Original mark sheets, certificates etc. will have to be
produced at the time of admission. For those opting for online submission, during the time of
admission they must submit attested copies of mark sheets and certificates of the last
examination passed and also produce the originals for verification.
The names of selected students will be announced two days before admission and he or she
will have to appear before a panel of selection committee for document verification where
they will have to produce the relevant original documents specified in the application form.
Students intending to study B.A./B.Sc. major course will have to specify option at most in two
subjects filling the space marked in the admission form. They will have to appear a screening
test or viva-voce in a date notified before admission. This test or viva voce will be arranged
by the departments. Therefore, the students are advised to communicate with the respective
departments before their admission.
Selection will be made on the basis of merit/performance in the screening test/viva voce.
However, there is reservation of seats as per State Government rules (as shown below).
Irregular students seeking admission must submit affidavit along with application forms for

General Rules for Maintenance of Discipline in the College

- 1. Various Societies and Associations of the College shall be subjected to such guidance and control as the college administration may prescribe from time to time.
- 2. Only those Societies or Associations having recognized by the Principal, can avail the facilities of the college premises.
- 3. Any notice desired to be pasted for circulation by the students anywhere in the college and hostel premises shall require the approval of the principal.
- 4. Principal's signature over the identity card shall be affixed within 15 days from the date of admission. Students shall keep the identity card with them in the college and in a position to produced it when demanded.
- 5. Filled up registration form of Council & University should be submitted in the office within the stipulated time as fixed by the College office. No registration form will be received after stipulated time.
- 6. For a pass certificate from the College, one has to apply one day ahead and for a transfer certificate, he/she has to apply at least two days ahead.
- 7. Class attendance of a students should not be less than 80%. Dis-collegiate rule will be strictly adhered to.
- 8. Attendance below 80% percent will render him/her non-collegiate and he/she will be allowed to sit for the examination only on payment of a fine of Rs. 500/-.
- 9. Un authorized absence for more than two days at a stretch will be met with a fine of Rs. 50/- per day. In case of emergency like sudden illness etc. verbal information by parents followed by proper application by the third day is a must.
- 10. Leave during sessional examination/ seminars/ group discussions etc. will be granted only on medical grounds in which case the student must appear for the sessional examination or seminar that he/she has missed on a date decided by the concerned department.
- 11. All Societies & Associations of the College shall be subject to guidance & control of the College authority. Only societies recognized by the authority shall have access to the facilities of the College campus.
- 12. No organization can be formed in the College without the permission of the Principal nor shall any person be allowed to hold meetings in the College without prior permission of the College authority.

Administrative action in the event of ragging.

The University rules pertaining to the punishment of students found guilty of ragging are as under.

- a). The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-ragging Squad.
- b) The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments.
- i) Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- ii) Withholding/withdrawing scholarship / fellowship and other benefits.
- iii) Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
- iv) Withholding results.
- iv) Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- v) Cancellation from admission
- vi) Restriction from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
- vii) Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
- viii) Fine of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only), or with imprisonment up to six months as per the Assam Prohibition of Ragging Act.1999.

Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment

5. Rights and Duties of Fresher's and their Guardians

The fresher shall after their admission consider the College as their second home behaving in the most humble manner and maintain cordial relationship with the senior students, faculty and staff of the college. The College shall always strive to establish ragging free environment and in case the fresher's feel that they are subjected to any form of ragging elaborated above, they should immediately report the matter to any member of the Anti-Ragging Committee, Anti-Ragging Squad, faculty or Staff of the College. The guardians shall co-operate with the authority to redress the grievance and help prevent the occurrence of ragging in the College. The identity of the fresher/ guardian shall be protected and shall not be divulged.

6. Rights and Duties of Senior Students.

The senior students have a special responsibility of welcoming the fresher's to the College for upkeeping the image of the College and the educational status of the region. Being a high institute of learning, the senior students are expected to lead by example and pave way for a healthy atmosphere in the College. The senior students have to bear the added responsibility of reporting any incident of ragging that attracts their attention. Their identity shall be protected in such instances.

7. Fresher's Introduction.

A systematically organized fresher's introduction/ Ice -Breaking session is arranged each year by the students union of the College in order to welcome fresher's to the college which maintains the decorum and dignity of the College.

8. Affidavit by the student and guardian

All students and parents/guardian of the college taking fresh admission in the academic session 2015-2016 are to submit 02 (two) copies of duly notarized affidavit signed by the student and his/her parent/guardian along with their admission forms, stating that they have gone through the booklet and the UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in Institutions of Higher Education and understood the definitions of ragging and implications of being involved in ragging: that they had never been involved in any act of ragging anywhere; and that they will fight for a ragging free environment in the College.

Facilities, Forums:

Hostel Facilities & Hostel Rules

The college has one Girls' hostel. Seats are allotted at the time of admission on the basis of merit. The students seeking hostel accommodation have to fill up a separate hostel

admission form which shall have to be submitted to the principal within allotted time. The number of seats in the girls' **hostel is 40.** The admission procedure and the hostel lodging is governed by the Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya hostel rules mentioned below.

- 1. The boarders must maintain decent, dignified disciplined hostel life inside and outside the hostel and obey the hostel rules.
- 2. They must abide by the rules and regulations of hostel as may be prescribed to them by the College authority, violations of which will lead to strict disciplinary action amounting to expulsion of the guilty inmates from the hostel leading to consequent expulsion from the College also.
- 3. All the boarders must abide by the mess-rules prescribed by the mess-committee of the hostel.
- 4. Boarders are not allowed to arrange any private mess within the hostel nor are they permitted to take meals outside the hostel.
- 5. Damage caused to hostel property by any boarder will be dealt with server punishment that may lead to the expulsion from the hostel as well as from the college.

College Library & Library Rules:

The Central Library of Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya was established in the year 1981 with the very inception of the college itself. The main objective of the library is to procure, organize, preserve and disseminate information in all fields of knowledge to serve the institutional, curricular, research and instructional requirements as well as the cultural needs of the college community. At present the number of books in the library is above 15,000 along with more than 15 journals and 10 daily newspapers. The Library is meant for only the bonafied students of the college. Two books are issued to each student. Students are entitled to keep books for fifteen days only from the date of issue and books must be returned to the library at the end of the period failing which fine of 1 rupee for first 7 days and 2 rupees after that are imposed. The students and teachers can avail the Library facility from 9am to 5pm on all working days. The Central library also provides E-resource facilities to the user community. More than 6,000 e-journals and 97,000 e-books are available now through UGC Inflibnet N-List Consortia. The users of the library especially the faculty members are also taking the benefits of some other services provided by Inflibnet like Shodh Gangotri, Shodh Ganga etc. The library has also been

adopting the benefit of using different Open Access Resources like Directory of Open Access Journal, Open Access Journal Search Engine, NISCAIR Online Periodical Repository etc.

At present the library is providing various services like Document Circulation Service, Reference service, Current Awareness Service, Internet / Digital resources facility, Reprographic and Printing Service, Consultancy Service, Book Bank Service, User orientation etc.

The library is automated by using the software SOUL 2.0. At present, the house keeping operations like cataloguing, circulation, bar coding and access to library catalogue through OPAC have been introduced.

The Central Library has its own Institutional Repository also. The JKM Institutional Repository is a repository of JKM's scholarship allowing digital works- text, audio-visual, data and more to be securely stored and reliably shared. The users can access these digital resources through an IP address provided by the librarian.

The library staffs are trying to better organize the library to make it more and more user friendly and to create a healthy learning environment within the library.

Library Card

Students need to furnish their fee receipt and the College Identity Card to obtained the library card. The library offers yearly membership, which is renewed subject to annual clearance. The library card is nontransferable.

Departmental Library

To add new features to the College, each and every Department has developed their respective Departmental Libraries with a view to acquaint the students with new good books and journals which are normally not available in the College Library. The required fund for this purpose is raised from the fund provided by the authority and the donations of the teachers and students of the respective departments.

Sports facilities:

The College has both indoor and outdoor activities for students. Faculty members are appointed by the authority as adviser for indoor and outdoor games and sports. The College has a well-equipped gymnasium.

Infrastructure Facilities:

Digital Classroom

The College has well furnished, well equipped Digital Classrooms. Besides, a fully digitalized Conference Hall that the departments use to organize seminars and also for taking classes from time to time.

Digital Conference Hall

The College has a well-furnished digital conference hall with a sitting capacity of 150 person. Important Meetings and Session of Seminars are conducted in the hall at regular intervals.

Canteen & Parking Facility:

The College has a well maintained canteen, which is kept open to serve the students. There is also facility for parking four wheelers and two wheelers in the campus.

Computer laboratory

The College has well equipped computer laboratory along with Technician and Instructors.

Health care Centre:

The College also has a Health Care Centre in College campus which provides necessary first aid treatment to the students during College hours.

24 hours electricity facility.

The College has 24 hours electricity backup facility which provides students proper reading environment both during the College Hours and also in the hostels.

Wi-Fi

The College provides wi-fi facility.

Botanical Garden.

A green and clean environment is a basic feature of the College: In order to add to its physical beautification the College is nursing a few flower gardens. The botanical garden accommodating various valuable/medicinal plants has acquired added dimensions during the present academic session. Besides, the Green House—'Dubori' promotes the cultivation of a variety of vegetables including king Chilies.

Facilitation of Higher Education for Persons with special needs.

Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya strictly adheres to basic directive of UGC for providing equal educational opportunities to differently abled persons.

Publication Cell

The College has a publication cell that takes initiative in publishing books. The Cell has recently published a rich study on Assamese short stories titled 'Asomiya Chuti Galpa: Aitijya aru Biborton' (2012). An ISBN publication, the book contains researched articles by eminent scholars and has been recommended as a reference book by the Dibrugarh University for the Department of Assamese. Except JKMSU, no other students' Association/ Union is recognized by the College.

Parents and guardians of the Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya are organized under the Parents and Guardians Association. It is helping to maintain reciprocity between the sides and get mutual feedback which is beneficial to students and the institution as well.

Alumni Association

Alumni Association of Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya is a forum of its ex-students. It was formed in 2003 and henceforth this association has not only providing an excellent liaison between the College and its former students but also contributing actively for development of the College.

Women's Cell

The Women Cell of Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya was established in 2005 with a sincere attempt to bring about a radical improvement in the condition of women around the rural locality in the neighborhood. Besides celebrating the International Women's'

Day each year, the Cell organizes various awareness programmes and also organizes skill based workshops for women from time to time. 'Janani' a magazine devoted to women is also brought out from this Cell at frequent intervals.

A cultural development cell has been set up in order to provide opportunity to talented students who are culturally inclined.

The debating society strives to give a platform to students who can speak out by building their public speaking skills which is a crucial attribute for any profession they wish to enter in the future. Debating society is not just meant for competitions, but it is also a platform for exchanging views, forming opinions, sharpening understanding and expanding worldview. The society organizes competitions within the college and also prepares students to take part in intra/inter - College debates.

Foundation Day Annual Lecture:

Foundation day of the college is celebrated annually by organizing Lectures by eminent educationists on relevant socio-academic issues. Besides a Blood Donation Camp is also organized on the eve of Foundation Day.

NCC

The NCC is an organization, which provides a golden opportunity for cadets to develop leadership qualities, self-confidence, to be disciplined and devoted citizen to promote the cause of national integration and nation building. The college has been running a three-year course for NCC cadets There are two NCC Units—33 ACTR NCC and 51 AIR ASSAM NCC units in the College.

The College has become a platform for Academic as well as Literary Excellence for both students and teachers. The College has a Research Journal entitled 'Candescent' which intends to address both applied and theoretical issues. The scope of the journal encompasses research articles, original research reports, reviews, short communications, scientific commentaries in the field of social sciences.

An interdisciplinary research journal on women cell named 'Janani' has been published regularly. This research journal addresses different empirical research article on women and allied subjects. It is an important platform to discuss about the plight of gender in Indian Society with special reference to Assam and North East India.

However the college is also becomes a platform for literary exposure to the students and to the teachers as it has published an annual Magazine named 'Jyotirmoy' and an occasional newpaper 'JKM News Letter'. The Students expresses their opinions, feelings and emotions towards society, mankind and the world by writings such as poems, short stories, articles and review etc. The newspaper 'JKM News Letter' highlights the events and activities of the College as well as provides scope for literary write-ups for students and teacher Community. All the departments of the College have their own magazines which covers different aspects of knowledge of the students.

Seminars:

National/International and State level seminars are arranged to provide a forum for eminent personalities to exchange their views with students & Teachers and also to create an academic atmosphere in and around the institution.

Celebration of Science Day and World Environment Day: The College Celebrates Science Day and World Environment Day in a grand way by engaging the students in an array of academic and creative activities.

Each Department of the College holds departmental Seminars for the benefit of the student as per schedule prescribed by the Department concerned.
