A Webinar on "Impact of Indian Freedom Movement in the development of Assamese Literature" was organised by Department of History and IQAC in Collaboration with Assam College Liberians' Association (ICT CELL) Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya, through video conferencing using Zoom platform along with live streaming in Facebook and ICT Cell of Assam College Librarian Association.

The Webinar was organised to remembering the 100 years of Non Cooperation Movement which was launched by Mahatma Gandhi as a part of the Indian Independence Movement. He briefed about the Non cooperation Movement in Assam which was begun under the banner of Indian National Congress and struggle against the colonial exploitation.
