1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process	
Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya follows the syllabus and curriculum set by the University of Dibrugarh which is intimated by the University to the College through regular circulars and the University website. An Academic calendar is prepared by the College	

in sync with the University calendar. Before the beginning of each new session, the distribution of portions of the syllabus among the faculty and a sketch of the course plan is prepared by each department and submitted to the Principal of the College. Likewise, before the end of each session, an account of syllabus completion or non-completion is submitted. To ensure ICT classes, three PPTs by each faculty is also submitted to the principal at the beginning of the session. A master time-table with allocation of rooms in accordance to the number of students per class, along with the names of faculty responsible for the class is displayed on the notice boards. Each department extracts from the master-time-table and prepares their own department time-tables and shares the same in department WhatsApp groups which has become a convenient way of sharing information, notifications, study-materials and for clarification of doubts by students. Every department maintains a log book of classes taken.

As an affiliated college, Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya follows the academic calendar provided by the University of Dibrugarh in conduction of different examinations, admissions and other related matters. The college prepares its own academic calendar in line with the University calendar, to execute the curriculum in an effective manner. The academic calendar of the college takes into consideration the university calendar and the various activities of the college to be conducted during the academic session that includes the schedule of internal examinations such as Sessional Examinations, dates of Seminars and group discussions to be organised by the departments for Internal Assessment, Field trips, Practical Examinations, Semester examinations etc., along with the

dates of different occasions to be organised by the College. The academic progress of the student is monitored through the conduction of two sessional examinations each semester, assignments, quizzes and group discussions. These are reflected in the IA marks received by the student in the semester examinations. The usual pattern of the academic session was however disrupted on account of covid resulting in changes and adjustments ordained by the parent University and as such students could not be handed out copies of the academic calendar at the time of admission.

As an affiliated College, the college follows the syllabus and curriculum of the Dibrugarh University. Integrated in the curriculum provided by the University to the affiliated colleges are compulsory papers on value education (4th Semester) and environmental studies (5th Semester) for all degree students. Besides the compulsory papers, courses on gender is ingrained in the syllabus of all the departments of the Humanities stream and a course on Professional Ethics comprises a part of the syllabus of the department of Philosophy. Moreover, the College also organises talks, workshops, seminars on these issues from time to time. A workshop on Yoga (Offline) as part of Value Education is organised yearly as part of celebration of International Yoga Day on 21 June 2022. To inculcate awareness on preservation of the environment, a short-video competition on theme "Only One Earth: Together we can protect it" was held as part of Environment Day Celebrations, Plantation sprees were organised and a National Seminar and Student Research Conclave on "Issues and Challenges of Environmental Safety for Sustainable Development" was held from 5th to 7th June 2022. An 'Idea drop' competition among students for Preservation of the Environment was a special feature of the celebrations this year.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The learning levels of students are assessed from the marks of their previous sessional examination/examinations. Allotments of Special classes/tutorial classes are accordingly made. Slow learners are

encouraged and prodded to recognize their shortcomings and attend the remedial classes. Moreover, continuous assessment components that include, Home Assignments, Seminars, Group Discussions, Quizzes, sessional examinations, and attendance, enable effective assessment of learning levels of students. The faculty takes keen interest in academic progress of students and counsel students to improve their performance to ensure their academic growth. The faculty is accessible to students at the personal level over phone and social apps. Corrected assignments and answer scripts are shared and discussed to enable students recognize their drawbacks and improve. Notes and study material on course content is provided to make learning easier. Advanced learners are encouraged to study Recommended Readings listed in syllabus. They are encouraged to help their peers by sharing their understanding on concerned areas. Online resources are made available to strengthen the knowledge-base. Advanced learners are encouraged to enrol in MOOC Courses - Swayam. The Faculty takes a keen interest while ordering books for the Central library and ascertains that the library collection of books cater to the needs of both slow and advanced learners.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Teaching methods based on various needs of different subjects are used for the effective delivery of the curriculum. Although the conventional lecture method is commonly used, the teaching

methodologies practiced in the College are interactive and student-centric. Learning becomes participatory and experiential when students learn by doing and by reflecting on experience and knowledge. While Practice teaching by students of the department of Education, Field trips undertaken by various departments, Internships in some courses, laboratory experiments conducted by the science streams are some examples where these methods are overtly used, all the departments use forms of student centric methods in the manner of written assignments and seminars where the student is encouraged to explore resources available in the library as well as e-resources to probe well into the subject assigned and thereby gather in-depth knowledge on the topic. Written assignments help the student to enhance confidence, develop writing skills and hone writing style, apart from inculcating an interest in research activities. Seminars, which form the second component of internal assessment, make students present papers before the entire class helping them overcome stage fear and develop oratory skills. Group discussions, quizzes, are other methods used that make learning participatory and student-centric.

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities to ensure efficient running of teaching, learning, and evaluation process. There are 28 class rooms for two streams (Arts and Science) and two special classrooms for conducting classes for the B.Voc and Diploma courses. There are two ICT enabled conference rooms; of 100 seater and 40 seater . The classrooms are well equipped to meet the needs of the students with adequate teaching -learning aids. The college also has a fully equipped spacious computer lab with 22 computers and a Language Lab with 17 computers . Besides a well-furnished central Library that caters to the needs of the students, there is a library in every department. The Library is also equipped with computers for the use of students . There are six laboratories for conducting practical classes in Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology ,Education and a lab for LED Bulb production and repairing . Besides, we have a room for IQAC, room for conducting Examinations, room for the Student's Union and room for NCC Classes. The Girl's hostel of the College can accommodate 40girls. Rest rooms for Boys and Girls, Gymnasium and sports grounds are other facilities present in the College. College is fully equipped with indoor games facilities such as Carrom, and Chess and outdoor facilities include Badminton, Kabaddi, Volleyball, Cricket, Shot Put, Long Jump , Javelin etc.

The library management software gives a user friendly interface for delivering timely services to the users under client-server environment. At present the housekeeping operations like cataloguing, circulation, bar coding, access to library catalogue through OPAC etc have been done by using SOUL 2.0 ILMS.

The Library has 16119 printed books and subscription of 13 periodicals and 7 newspapers. It has its own repository of Minor and Major Research Project Reports, PhD Thesis, MPhil Dissertations, Publication of the college, publication of faculties, College Magazines etc. Library conducts stock verification process repeatedly during semester break. . Library has a reading room with 50+ seating capacity. There is a separate reading area for the faculty members.

1.Solid Waste Management-

- The waste generated by all sorts of routine activities carried out in the College is segregated at source level into different coloured dustbins on the basis of their degradability. Apart from this, bamboo dustbins are provided

in different locations within the campus. The Biodegradable waste collected from the college campus is used in the Vermicomposting Unit to produce vermicompost.

Few attempts of solid waste management have also been taken by few departments of the college-

- The different solid waste collected from the college campus are burnt at a high temperature in a unique incinerator designed by the Chemistry Department.
- The Chemistry department collects and decompose organic waste from the college canteen and hostel in a cylindrical drum designed by them.
- The organic waste is also decomposed in a biogas plant digester to produce biogas.
