It was the last capital of Ahom Kingdom and home to many historical monuments of Assamese culture. Jorhat is also an important commercial and educational centre of Upper Assam producing many famous industrialists, educationists, scholars, writers, historians etc.

ABOUT JORHAT KENDRIYA MAHAVIDYALAYA

Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya was established in the year 1981 with a view to meet the higher educational needs of a large locality of East Jorhat. It is one of the premier co-educational institutions in Assam offering courses of study in both Arts and Science Stream. The college is permanently affiliated to Dibrugarh University. In parallel with the introduction of the semester system by the university from 2011-2012, the college has introduced B.A. and M.A. in Distance mode under Dibrugarh University.

The College has also introduced the Community College Scheme of UGC in 2015 by starting a one year Diploma Course in "Tea Plantation and Management" and B. Voc. from October, 2018. Under the regime of Prime Minister Narendra Modi who came to power in 2014, the policy received immense priority. The slight change in the terminology from 'Look East' to 'Act East' enabled a marked shift in India's perspective of the world. A sense of the change in the lotus of world economic power from the 'west' to 'east' is highlighted and the strategic and economic importance of Southeast Asia to India's National interest being recognized. India's 'Look East Policy' was impelled by economic and political imperatives whereas India's 'Act East Policy' was impelled by India's strategic imperatives to establish its strategic footprints in South East

The North East of India is situated at a pivotal location having easy connectivity with the South Asian Countries. Any effective deliberation on implementation of the Act East Policy of the Government of India will amply be fruitful if pursued on the background of this region. Extensive deliberations in the prospective background of this region is very essential in order to harvest the benefits of the progress of South Asian countries. It is therefore felt necessary to deliberate on the 'Act East Policy' in the interest of rapid development of North-East India- the region with high prospects in the areas of economic development, socio-cultural exchange and tourism development.

The implementation of India's Act East Policy has the potential to transform the North East India to a region of peace and economic prosperity.
