

Academic and Cultural Exchange Programme Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya with

Report:

A bilateral agreement for academic and research collaboration—memorandum of understanding was signed between the faculty of Archaeology, Silpakorn University, Bangkok, Thailand and Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya on 16.05. 2018 for a term of five years.





The first even undertaken under the aegis of the MoU was the international conference on "India's Act East Policy: Problems and Prospects in Socio-Cultural and Economic Development of North-East India" held on 28th and 29th of January 2019.



The Conference was attended by four members from shilpakorn university. The second event undertaken was the academic and cultural exchange programme undertaken by Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya during December 19th to 22nd 2019 where a team of teachers and students visited Silpakorn University.

A group of teachers and students of Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya under the leadership of Dr. Munindra Konwar, Principal, Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya, had undertaken an academic and cultural exchange Programme with the University of Silpakorn, Bangkok, Thailand during December 19th to 22^{nd,} 2019. The teacher delegates of the History department presented a paper on Historical monuments of Assam, while the students performed a cultural programme presenting Bhatat Natyam, Satriya Dance and Bihu etc., at a grand function held at the Centre for Sanskrit Learning of the University. While anchoring the programme, Dr. Arunima Borah focused on the Cultural heritage of Assam with special reference to Sattriya culture created by Mahapurusha Shankardeva. Mr. Pranjal Dutta highlighted the educational facilities available in Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya. Dr Munindra Konwar, the Principal of the

College called upon the University to venture students to study in Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya and also to pursue research in History and Archeology in Assam. Dr. Chawalit Khaokhiew, the Dean and Professor of the Archeology department welcomed the group and spoke about the different subjects available for study at the University. A beautiful programme on Thai music and dance was presented by students of the university. After deliberations it was decided that a team of students of the college would take part in an academic workshop of ten days duration at the University in the month of July next year.
