THE COLLEGE AT A GLANCE

Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya is a promising Co-educational premier institution in North- East India offering courses of study in both Arts and Science streams. The College is located at Kenduguri, 3 km. east of Jorhat city centre and is well linked by NH-37 as well as by the Assam Trunk Road. The College was established in 1981 with the noble objective of meeting the needs of higher education of a large locality, quite a number of who belong to the rural and economically weak backgrounds. The College is permanently affiliated to Dibrugarh University. The Arts Stream of the college was brought under the deficit grants-in-aid system from January 11, 1996. Spurred by the interest of students, the Science Stream was introduced from the academic session 1991-92 and received Provincialized status in 2021. The College currently provides Higher Secondary, UG (FYUGP), UG, PG and Diploma courses in Distance mode under CDOE, DU; and KKHOSU to more than a thousand students every academic year. Spread over sixteen departments, viz. Assamese, Botany, Chemistry, Economics, Education, English, History, Mathematics, Philosophy, Physics, Political Science, Sociology, Geography, Statistics and Zoology and Computer Science, the curriculum followed by the College at the Degree level is the one prescribed by Dibrugarh University. For Higher Secondary (viz. Arts and Science stream), the syllabus and curriculum followed is the one prescribed by the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council. Apart from this, from the academic session 2015, the Tea Plantation and Management Course has been introduced under Community College Scheme sponsored by UGC and from the Academic Session 2018-19, the College introduced the UGC sponsored 3-year Bachelor of Vocational Course (B.Voc) in Small Tea Garden Management. In 2022, eight DU approved Add-on Certificate Courses were introduced, NSDC Approved Skill Courses under PM Vishwakarma Yojana & PMKVY-4.0 and DU approved certificate courses. Under the Incubation and Innovation Cell (Registered as IIC JKM in Innovation Cell, Ministry of Education, Govt. of India, IC-202115536) the College has undertaken various start-up initiatives involving students. The College is also the nodal centre for virtual science lab and virtual English lab. The College is accredited with Grade 'A' (CGPA-3.20) by NAAC and achieved 3.5 Star Rating by IIC-MIC, GoI, Ministry of Education (MoE). The College is also a 'Lead College'(Jorhat District) for H.S Courses (ASSEB Division II).

The College, with its academic zeal, aims at providing quality education to rural students while augmenting their meaningful participation in both curricular and extra-curricular activities. The focus is on the process of teaching-learning in rural context with a sense of social responsibility. The college upholds the spirit of humanism and strives to inculcate rationalism among its stakeholders. The College strives to uphold its motto 'Satyameva Jayate' engraved on the emblem of the College. Taken from the Mundaka Upanishad, the words translate into English as 'Truth alone triumphs'. The line signifies a rootedness to the rich cultural values of the nation and is suggestive of a desire to create confident, dedicated honest and upright individuals who become assets to the society.

There exists an atmosphere of cordial relationship between the students and teachers in the College. Apart from academic pursuits, stress is laid on co-curricular activities and all-round development of the students' personality. Special attention is paid to the students coming from backward and marginalized sections of society whose welfare was on the top of the agenda when the College was established. The College has a well-equipped library, which is supervised and managed by a qualified Librarian. The library is fully digitalized. Photocopier machine and computers with Internet facilities are available in the College Library. For the benefit of students from economically weaker backgrounds the College has been providing the facility of a Book Bank from the academic session 2011-12.

Set in a campus with greenery of trees, beautiful flower gardens, well positioned decorative flower pots, the College boasts of its scenic beauty and pleasing environment that provides a breather from the noisy atmosphere of the city.

What had started as a humble effort to spread the light of higher education amongst the locality and its neighboring areas has now flowered in to an institution of repute rendering quality education to students from different parts of Assam. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- The date of scrutiny of documents cum admission into HS and Degree Programmes are notified through local dailies immediately after the declaration of results. Admission schedules are also notified through the college notice board and College website - www.jorhatkendriyamahavidyalaya.in
- For admission into the H.S Course, Students need to apply through **Darpan Portal** <https://darpan.ahseconline.in/>
- For admission into the UG Course, Students need to apply through **Samarth Portal** <https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in/>
- Students must submit attested copies of mark sheets and certificates of the last examination passed at the time of admission. Original mark sheets, certificates etc., will also have to be produced at the time of admission for verification.
- Students intending to study B.A./B.Sc. major course will have to specify option at most in two subjects filling the space marked in the admission form. The students are advised to communicate with the respective departments before their admission.
- Selection will be made on the basis of merit. However, there is reservation of seats as per State Government rules (as shown below).
- Irregular students seeking admission must submit affidavit along with application forms for the gap period.
- Incomplete application forms will be treated as cancelled.

Multiple Exit Facility in Four Year Undergraduate Programme (B.A/B.Sc)

Exit 1: There is a provision of exit after successful completion of 1 year (two semesters). A Certificate will be awarded when a student exits at the end of year 1 (2 semesters). Students who have secured minimum of 40 credits will be awarded a UG certificate (in the field of study/discipline) if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 2nd semester examination.

Exit 2: There is a provision of exit after successful completion of 2 years (four semesters). A Diploma will be awarded when a student exits at the end of year 2 (4 semesters). Students

who have secured minimum of 80 credits will be awarded a UG. Diploma (in the field of study/discipline) if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 4th Semester examination.

Exit 3: Three Year UG Degree Programme (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelor in other discipline) with single/double major: There is a provision of exit after successful completion of 3 years (six semesters). Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme shall be awarded UG degree in the major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 120 credits.

Four Year UG Programme with Honours (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelor in other discipline) with single/double major: Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours degree in the major discipline after successful completion of four years with Discipline Specific Elective Courses in 7th and 8th semesters in lieu of Research Project and Dissertation, securing a minimum of 160 credits.

Four Year UG Programme with Honours with Research (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelor in other discipline) with single/double major: Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours with Research degree in the major discipline after successful completion of four years, with Research Project and Dissertation in 7th and 8th Semesters, securing 160 credits.

Examination and Evaluation:

(a) Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least two times during a Semester including the End Semester Examination.

(b) There shall be 40% marks for in-semester assessment and 60% marks for End-semester examination in each course during every semester.

(c) There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer-scripts of the end-semester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny.

(d) In-semester Assessment:

(i) In in-semester assessment, different tools such as objective tests, written tests, assignments, paper presentation, laboratory work, etc. suitable to the courses may be employed.

(ii) The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shall be required to compulsorily attend in-semester assessment including appearing the sessional tests, failing which they will not be allowed to appear for the End-semester examination. A Student cannot repeat In-semester examinations. The Department/Centre for Studies may arrange special in-semester examination whenever necessary.

(e) End Semester Examination:

(i) There shall be one End semester examination carrying 60% Marks in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the Course. The End semester examination is normally a written/laboratory-based examination.

(ii) The Controller of Examinations shall make necessary arrangements for notifying the dates of the End semester examinations and other procedures as per Dibrugarh University Rules (at least 20 days in advance) and the Academic Calendar notified by the University.

(iii) The time given for End-semester examination for each Course shall be based on the credits/marks of the course.

Betterment Examination:

- A student shall be entitled to take the 'Betterment Examinations' in any two theory course after successful completion of 3 year/4year programme only once. In this case, the higher marks secured by the student shall be retained. The candidates shall have to apply for betterment examination within one year of passing the Sixth/Eight Semester examination. Students shall have to appear in the betterment examination with the regular batch.
- No betterments shall be allowed in the practical/project/dissertation/internship examinations.

Results and Progression:

A candidate shall be declared as passed a Programme, provided he/she secures

- At least 40% of marks in each Course in the End Semester Examinations combining both theory and practical examinations
- At least 'P' grade in the 10 point scale combining both the in-semester and End Semester Examination performance.
- There shall be no separate pass mark for In-semester Assessment. A candidate shall be declared as passed a semester/ programme, provided he/ she secures
- at least 'P' grade in the 10 point scale in all the Courses separately. There may be moderation of In-semester Assessment marks/End Semester marks as and when necessary.

Points to note:

- A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more Courses of any end semester examinations up to fifth Semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed course as carry over course(s).
- Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the carryover course in the next regular examinations of those courses.
- If a candidate fails in any of the components (either theory or practical) of a course the candidate shall have to reappear in the examination for both the components.
- If a candidate clears the sixth semester examination before clearing all the courses of the previous semesters, the result of the sixth semester examination of that candidate shall be withheld and his/ her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of the previous semesters.
- A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of seventh semester examinations shall be provisionally promoted to the eighth semester with the failed course as carry over course(s).
- If a candidate clears the eight-semester examination before clearing all the courses of the seventh semesters, the result of the eighth semester examination of that candidate shall be withheld and his/ her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of the previous semester.
- A student must clear all his/her Semester Examinations within six (6) years for three-year undergraduate programme and seven years for four-year undergraduate programme (with honours/research) from the dates of admission to the First Semester of any Programme irrespective of the number of examinations appeared by the student.
- Since the Semester system involves continuous assessment, there shall be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any programme in this system.
- A candidate shall be declared to have passed provided he/she has passed all the Semesters and in all the Courses separately for the concerned programme.
- The Controller of Examinations shall declare the results of different programmes and issue Grade-sheets. The merit list shall be prepared only for the regular candidates and it does not include the backlog candidates.

Attendance:

- A student who has less than **75% attendance** shall not be permitted to sit for the End-semester examinations in the course in which the shortfall exists. Provided that it shall be open to the University to grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 75% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 75% attendance for valid reason on recommendation of the Head of the Department on payment of a prescribed fee(s).

COLLEGE RULES AND REGULATIONS

10. Leave during sessional examination/ seminars/ group discussions etc. will be granted only on medical grounds in which case the student must appear for the sessional examination or seminar that he/she has missed on a date decided by the concerned department.
11. All Societies & Associations of the College shall be subject to guidance & control of the College authority. Only those societies recognized by the authority shall have access to the facilities of the College campus.
12. No organization can be formed in the College without the permission of the Principal nor shall any person be allowed to hold meetings in the College without prior permission of the College authority.

Administrative action in the event of Ragging.

The University rules pertaining to the punishment of students found guilty of ragging are as under.

- ❑ The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-ragging Squad.
- ❑ The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments.
 - Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
 - Withholding/withdrawing representing / fellowship and other benefits.
 - Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
 - Withholding results. scholarship
 - Debarring from the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
 - Cancellation from admission
 - Restriction from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters
 - Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
 - Fine of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only), or with imprisonment up to six months as per the Assam Prohibition of Ragging Act.1999.

Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment

Rights and Duties of Fresher's and their Guardians

The fresher shall after his/her admission consider the College as a second home behaving in the most humble manner and maintain cordial relationship with the senior students, faculty and staff of the college. The College shall always strive to establish a ragging free environment and in case the fresher's feel that they are subjected to any form of ragging elaborated above, they should immediately report the matter to any member of the Anti-Ragging Committee, Anti-Ragging Squad, faculty or Staff of the College. The guardians shall co-operate with the authority to redress the grievance and help prevent the occurrence of ragging in the College. The identity of the fresher/ guardian shall be protected and shall not be divulged.

Rights and Duties of Senior Students

The senior students have a special responsibility of welcoming the freshers to the College for upkeeping the image of the College and the educational status of the region. Being a high institute of learning, the senior students are expected to lead by example and pave way for a healthy atmosphere in the College. The senior students have to bear the added responsibility of reporting any incident of ragging that attracts their attention. Their identity shall be protected in such instances.

Library Facilities:

The Central Library of Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya was established in the year 1981 with the very inception of the college itself to support its parent organization in carrying out its teaching learning programme effectively. Its main objective is to procure, organize, preserve, disseminate information in all

The Library has at present nearly 20000 printed books and subscription to 23 periodicals and 7 newspapers. The library is an automated one since 2015 with the leading software SOUL2.0 provided by INFLIBNET Centre. The library management software gives a user friendly interface for delivering timely services to the users under client-server environment. At present the housekeeping operations like cataloguing, circulation, barcoding, member log in, access to library catalogue through OPAC, Web OPAC etc. have been done by using SOUL 2.0 ILMS.

Information Deployment and Notification: The general Information regarding library facilities are made available in the college prospectus, Academic Calendar and the college website. The current notifications are put up in the Library Notice Board and the College Notice Board.

ILMS in the Library: The library is an automated one since 2015 with the leading software SOUL2.0 provided by INFLIBNET Centre. The library management software gives a user friendly interface for delivering timely services to the users under client-server environment.

Barcode Technology: Barcode-based attendance system for students are placed at the library entrance while visiting the library and also in circulating the books.

Searching through OPAC/ WebOPAC : Since the library is fully automated, the holdings of the library can be searched using OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) and WebOPAC.

Wi-Fi-based Library: The College Library is Wi-Fi based library. Library users can use the WiFi service in the reading hall and in the digital library section.

Digital Library Section: The library has a separate digital library section well connected to the internet.

Membership of E-Contents: The Library is a member of e-ShodhSindhu consortium which provides access to 6000+ e-journals, 1,99,500+ e-books under NList and 6,00,000+ e-books through National Digital Library (NDL)

WhatsApp-based circulation: Students and faculty members of Jorhat Kendriya Mahavidyalaya are connected with the library through 3 (Three) WhatsApp Groups. All important information, notices, new arrival of books, etc. are shared in those groups .

Reprographic and Printing Service : Students avail these facilities in the library in a nominal fee.

User Orientation : A User Orientation and Awareness Programme is done every year at the beginning of the new academic session to make the students aware of various library services and facilities.

Question Paper Facility : The students can consult previous year question papers in the library .They get soft copies of the question papers also.

Best practices in the library : The library offers Best Library User Award every year to motivate the students to use library regularly. Different competitions like essay writing competition, book review competition, poem writing competition etc are also being regularly organized among the students.

Working Hour: 9am to 4 pm

Library Rules and Regulations:

1. The library is meant for only the Bonafide students of the college. However, the authority reserves the provision of permission to special users.

2. While borrowing books from the library, each student will have to produce his/her library card. A student is not entitled to borrow a book against the library card of others. If detected, he/she will be punished or fined.



3. Students are not allowed to use the library without uniform.

4. 03 books will be issued to each student, 08 books for teachers and 04 books for non-teaching staff. Students will be entitled to keep books for fifteen days only from the date of issue. Books must be returned to the library at the end of the period failing which fine of 2 rupee will be imposed. However, the students can reissue the books for another 7 days with the permission of the librarian.

5. Students can avail lending facility till they appear final examination of an academic session.

6. Rare books, reference books, periodicals, news paper are not allowed for home lending. Books & periodicals issued against the reading section card will be allowed to use in the library reading hall which will have to be returned at time of leaving.

7. Books have to be replaced if lost or damaged. Students found mutilating library books or periodicals will be subject to disciplinary action.

8. Strict silence and decorum should be observed in the library.

9. Using mobile phone is strictly prohibited in the library premises without the permission of the Librarian.

10. Users should obey the library rules and regulations. Violation of rules and any act of misbehaviour to the library staff will lead to strong disciplinary action.

The college provides hostel facilities for eligible students. Admission to the hostel is subject to availability and will be granted based on the following criteria:

1. **Academic Merit:** Students must have secured a satisfactory percentage in their most recent qualifying examination.



2. **Economic Background:** Preference will be given to students from economically disadvantaged backgrounds.
3. **Distance from the College:** Students residing at a considerable distance from the college will be given priority.

All applicants are required to submit valid supporting documents for the above criteria at the time of application. Hostel seats are limited and will be allocated on a priority basis.

Hostel Rules

- The boarders must maintain decent, dignified disciplined hostel life inside and outside the hostel and obey the hostel rules.
- They must abide by the rules and regulations of hostel as may be prescribed to them by the College authority, violations of which will lead to strict disciplinary action amounting to expulsion of the guilty inmates from the hostel leading to consequent expulsion from the College also.
- All the boarders must abide by the mess-rules prescribed by the mess-committee of the hostel.
- Boarders are not allowed to arrange any private mess within the hostel nor are they permitted to take meals outside the hostel.
- Damage caused to hostel property by any boarder will be dealt with severe punishment that may lead to the expulsion from the hostel as well as from the college.
- Expulsion from the hostel will cause expulsion from the College also.

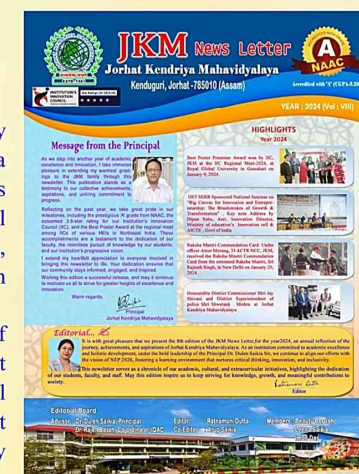
